Strengths

- ✓ **Geology of Delaware Basin**
Oil and Gas Reserves are being compared to Arabian Peninsula. Companies are flocking to Delaware Basin communities from Midland, Houston, DFW, and Oklahoma City to build regional offices, transloading facilities, processing plants, and infrastructure.
- ✓ **Mining**
Mining is still strong with 50-70 years of known potash ore left to mine.
- ✓ **Tourism**
Carlsbad Caverns National Park had its highest visitation in decades last year.
- ✓ **Nuclear Storage Facility**
Nuclear- WIPP is at its highest employment level in years, URENCO is strong, Eddy Lea Energy Alliance (ELEA)'s consolidated interim storage facility is in NRC permitting stage and will mean more nuclear jobs when it opens in a few years.
- ✓ **Manufacturing**
Manufacturing is increasing in Carlsbad Area with four companies increasing their operations this year. Carlsbad has ample water to increase its manufacturing operations.
- ✓ **Agriculture**
Pecan, Chile, Alfalfa, and Cotton production remain strong. Our region still has ample water to maintain or increase this production.
- ✓ **Low unemployment**
Lowest unemployment of industrialized counties- but this becomes a challenge if too low.
- ✓ **Air Service**
Air Service is improving (Roswell's flights to Phoenix, DFW; Hobbs' flights to Houston; Carlsbad's daily flights to Albuquerque and DFW) to entire region.
- ✓ **Rail Service**
Heavy rail service (BNSF) is strong. Several new transloading facilities are under construction or are currently under construction in Eddy County.

Challenges

- ✓ **Housing**
Housing is our area's #1 challenge. We have some housing under construction, but both the City of Carlsbad and Eddy County's recent housing studies call for thousands of units over the next five years.
- ✓ **Unemployment**
Unemployment- Employee Recruitment starts to be a challenge as the unemployment rate dips to 4% and below.
- ✓ **Remoteness**
Distance from major metropolitan municipalities, distribution networks, and ports is a challenge to company and worker recruitment.
- ✓ **State Income Tax**
State Income Tax hinders some companies from setting up headquarters in our state.
- ✓ **Commodity markets**
Commodity markets can affect oil, gas, potash and agricultural markets. Diversity is key to averting hardship during a downturn.
